**ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2017-4 OF THE
BOROUGH OF WOODLYNNE, IN THE COUNTY OF
CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY**

WHEREAS, on May 11, 2017, the Borough of Woodlynne, County of Camden, New Jersey ("Borough") duly and finally adopted Ordinance 2017-04 ("Bond Ordinance"), authorizing various general capital improvements in and for the Borough ("Prior Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to amend the appropriations authorized in the Bond Ordinance by amending Sections 7 and 8 thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Woodlynne, County of Camden, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law, Chapter 169 of the Laws of 1960 of the State of New Jersey, as amended and supplemented ("Local Bond Law"), as follows:

Section 1. Sections 7 and 8 of the Bond Ordinance are hereby amended to provide as follows:

Section 7. The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which said obligations are to be issued; the estimated costs of each said purpose; the amount of down payment for each said purpose; the maximum amount of obligations to be issued for each said purpose and the period of usefulness of each said purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law are as follows:

Section 8. The average period of useful life of the several purposes for the financing of which this Bond Ordinance authorizes the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized for said several purposes, is not less than 9.23 years."

Section 2. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the regulations promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail the amended capital budget and capital improvement program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, are on file with the Clerk and available for public inspection.

Section 3. All other parts of the Bond Ordinance are not amended hereby shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. In accordance with the Local Bond Law, this ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

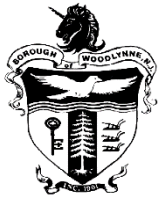

WHEREAS, the Borough of Woodlynne is the owner of real property known as Block 503, Lot 38 & 1; Borough of Woodlynne, County of Camden, State of New Jersey (collectively the “Properties”); and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Woodlynne has determined that the Property is not needed for public use; and the sale of the Property will return the Property to the tax rolls of the Borough of Woodlynne; and it is in the best interests of the Borough of Woodlynne to offer the Property for sale by open public auction to the highest bidder.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Woodlynne, County of Camden and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. The Borough of Woodlynne is the owner of the following lands located within the Borough of Woodlynne (hereinafter referred to as the “Property”):

SECTION 2. The Governing Body of the Borough of Woodlynne has determined it to be the public interest to sell said Property by open public sale at auction to the highest bidder in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(a) and the terms of sale provided for in this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. The Governing Body declares the Property to be surplus and not needed for public use.

SECTION 4. The following conditions for the sale of the Property apply:

(a) The minimum bid for the Property is as follows:

(b) The highest bidder will be awarded the bid, subject to the provisions below, including execution of a Contract of Sale and confirmation by the Governing Body.

(c) The Borough will only accept bids calling for an all cash purchase of the Property. Full payment of the purchase price must be received within 30 days of the date of the acceptance of the bid. The successful bidder will be required to pay, by either cash, wire transfer or bank check, a deposit equal to ten (10%) percent of minimum price of the bid at the close of bidding, with the balance to be paid by either cash, wire transfer or bank check at closing. Pending closing of title, this deposit will be held by the Borough of Woodlynne in a non-interest bearing escrow account, with the total deposit (excluding interest) to be credited to the purchaser price at closing.

(d) The sale of the Property is being made subject to the terms, conditions, restrictions and limitations herein, including but not limited to the following terms and conditions:

1. The property is being sold in an "AS IS" "WHERE IS" condition with no representations by the Borough. The successful bidder is responsible for conducting any and all inspections and testing of the Property at its own cost and expense.
2. The property is being sold subject to existing zoning;
3. The successful bidder shall bear the burden of paying any and all required sewer service and/or connecting fees associated with the use of the Property.
4. The successful bidder shall pay prorated real estate taxes for the balance of the current year as of the date of closing of title.
5. The successful bidder shall bear the burden of obtaining any and all approvals from the appropriate municipal, county or government agency, if applicable. The successful bidder shall also bear the burden of obtaining and paying for any and all necessary permits, connections and/or arrangements to provide for water, electric, sewer, or solid waste disposal.

6. The closing of title to the Property is “TIME OF THE ESSENCE” and must take place within 30 days of the date of acceptance of the bid by Council and the failure of the successful bidder to close title as agreed shall result in the successful bidder’s forfeiture of any and all money deposited with the Borough.
7. The purchaser(s) shall pay the cost of all recording fees and title company changes.
8. The purchaser(s) shall pay any and all realty transfer and “mansion” taxes assessed in connection with the sale of the Property.
9. With respect to the sale of the Property herein, NO real estate commission is owed.
10. No representation is made by the Borough as to the utility, usability or environmental condition of the Property.

(e) All bidders must satisfy the requirements of this Ordinance and meet any terms and conditions of the Contract of Sale. The successful bidder will execute a Contract upon completion of bidding its payment of the required deposit. To execute the Contract, the bidder shall properly execute the Contract in the signature spaces at the end. The Borough Administrator is authorized to execute the contract, which shall be subject to confirmation by Council. Failure to execute the Contract properly shall not affect the obligation of the successful bidder or the validity of the sale. The deed given by Woodlynne Borough for the Property will be a quitclaim deed. No title contingencies or conditions are permitted. However, if buyer’s title company determines the Borough is unable to convey marketable title, the Borough will refund the deposit upon request prior to closing and the parties shall be released from the contract.

(f) In the event that the successful bidder fails to close title to the Property, the bidder shall forfeit all deposit monies made to the Borough. No refunds whatsoever will be made by the Borough of Woodlynne in the event that the successful bidder fails to complete the purchase of the Property within thirty (30) days from the acceptance of the bid by Council except as to paragraph (e) above.

(g) The sale may be subject to adjournment or cancellation by the Borough.

(h) Bidders may bid on the Property until the Borough Clerk, acting as the auctioneer, strikes a final bid on the Property. The highest bid when struck will be the purchase price for the Property subject to the Borough’s acceptance or rejection of the bid.

(i) At the auction the Borough reserves the right to accept the highest responsive bid equal to or greater than the minimum bid price, or to reject all bids at the public sale and not to award to the highest bidder. The Borough reserves the right to waive any and all defects and informalities in any proposal, and to accept or reject the highest responsible and responsive bid deemed to be in the best interest of the Borough. Bidders must register at the auction, providing contact information, and they will then be assigned a bidder number.

(j) The Borough acceptance or rejection of bids shall be made not later than at the second regular Borough Council meeting following the auction. No bid shall be considered finally accepted until passage by the Borough Council of a Resolution accepting such bid.

(k) The Property is being sold “**AS IS**” “**WHERE IS.**” The Property is sold subject to existing encumbrances, liens, easements, zoning ordinances, other restrictions of record, such facts as an accurate survey would reveal and any present or future assessments for the construction of improvements benefiting the Property. A survey of the Property may be conducted by any prospective bidder, at its discretion, as part of its due diligence.

(l) Any material prepared and distributed in connection with this auction sale is for convenience purposes only and is intended to give prospective bidders a general understanding of the condition, location and size of the Property. The Borough of Woodlynne is not responsible for errors that may appear in such materials. Each prospective bidder is urged to thoroughly research and examine the Property prior to placing a bid. The Property will be available for inspection by appointment only. Prospective bidders desiring to inspect the Property should contact the, Borough Clerk at (856) 962-8300 between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. to make an appointment.

(m) It is suggested and recommended that potential bidders perform title searches and/or last owner and lien searches on the properties that they are interested in bidding upon prior to the date of the bid submission in order that the potential bidder may be adequately apprised of any encumbrances or restrictions of record affecting the use and enjoyment of the property or properties. It is further suggested and recommended that potential bidders exercise due diligence with respect to every state of facts including open permits, local titles, penalties, taxes, assessments, etc., which may not be of record but which may nonetheless affect the use and enjoyment of the property or properties. The Borough of Woodlynne shall not be responsible for the costs associated with such searches in the event that the Borough of Woodlynne is unable to convey title and/or if a bid is rejected.

SECTION 5. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 6. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or any part of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance not directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

SECTION 7. This Ordinance shall take effect after final adoption and publication as required by law.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq., authorizes any local unit of the State to enter into a contract with any other local unit or units for the joint provision within their jurisdictions of any service which any party to the agreement is empowered to render within its own jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of New Jersey is committed to supporting and advancing local government shared service solutions to enhance the provision of local services and alleviate the property tax burden on the State's residents and businesses; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Borough of Woodlynne recognizes that shared services may result in property tax relief and enhanced services for its constituents; and

WHEREAS, in an attempt to receive more favorable prices than the current contract prices and reduce the cost for solid waste disposal for the interested municipalities within Camden County, which collect and haul their solid waste, the Borough of Somerdale intends to solicit bids for the disposal of solid waste for the Borough of Somerdale and any other interested self-hauling municipalities, with the contract beginning January 1, 2022 and being for a period of up to five years; and

WHEREAS, it is expected that the commitment of the disposal of the specified, estimated annual tonnage of solid waste from the participating municipalities, which is a tonnage that several disposal facilities have the capacity to handle, will provide for more competitive bid prices, resulting in a reduction in the cost for the disposal of solid waste for all participating municipalities; and

WHEREAS, in order to receive the anticipated, reduced costs for the disposal of solid waste, it will be necessary for all participating municipalities to commit to the delivery of their solid waste to the contracted firm's facility; and

WHEREAS, it is intended that all participating municipalities will commit to the award of a contract to the lowest responsible bidder if it is determined that the bid price is considered to be a favorable price and results in a reduction in cost for solid waste disposal for each municipality for the intended term of the contract; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Woodlynne desires to participate in the shared services contract and be included as a participating municipality in the bid specifications for the disposal of solid waste, beginning on January 2, 2022, with the Borough of Somerdale and any other interested municipality within Camden County;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Mayor and Council of the Borough of Woodlynne, in the County of Camden, State of New Jersey hereby authorizes the participation in the shared services agreement and inclusion in the bid specifications for the disposal of solid waste with the Borough of Somerdale.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council commits to the award of a contract if it is determined that the bid price is considered to be a favorable price and results in a reduction of cost for solid waste disposal for each participating municipality for the intended term of the contract.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor is hereby authorized to represent the Borough of Woodlynne, regarding any discussions and matters associated with the disposal of solid waste, under this shared services agreement.
